Initiative attracts 14 company-volunteers

With the general objective of producing more industry-ready IT graduates and professionals now and in the future, the Philippine Software Industry Association (PSIA) takes a major step towards Filipino global competitiveness and gathers its members to help fulfill this seemingly herculean yet significant task.

Through 14 company-volunteers, the PSIA has formed two adhoc committees namely **Adopt-a-School / Internship Committee** which aims a solid and unified partnership

with colleges and universities to organize an internship program for IT students similar to that of the medical profession, and a **Finishing School Committee** which focuses to attract non-IT professionals and career shifters or those who are currently programmers to move up in their skill and expertise levels. These groups will be supported by a Public Relations Group that will shout out to the country the merits of the IT profession and promote the IT path to both students and parents.

People Management seminar features NY-based expert, top industry leaders

PSIA opens seminar series to public

The third installment of the PSIA Project Management Seminar Series featured a returning Filipino expert from New York and top-caliber panelists, that it was regarded by many as one of the best seminars so far!

Elmer Velasquez of NY-based social enterprise, Global Acumen, and advisory firm, Heidrick & Struggles, brought back to Manila his expertise and knowledge from the Columbia Business School through the three-hour session tagged as **People Management: Managing Human Energy in a Project Environment**, which gathered about 110 project managers and industry executives last July 29.

The good mix of notable panelists and an entertaining moderator gave a special twist to this regular session and contributed largely to its success.

The panelists included Pointwest Technologies' Chona Ahorro, HR Management Consultant Melette Go Yanko, and STORM Consulting and Flexible Benefits advocate Peter Paul Cauton. Gurango Software's Tarca Taruc was the moderator.

Velasquez shared practical concepts on managing the human resource by enumerating the cases of such giant software companies as Apple, Microsoft, Google, and IBM, as well as the story of Sim City, and how well they attracted and harnessed the best quality people managers. He and the panelists likewise shared various helpful book titles with the attendees.

The seminar was also opened to the public for the first time, having started as an exclusive offering to its members in September 2009.

The Enablement Seminar Series is a project of the PSIA Capability Development Committee, which aims to "enable" the members of the association through valuable seminars and trainings, hence the series' name. The committees include top executives from both big players and SMEs as volunteers, namely, Accenture, BlastAsia, Computer Professionals Inc., DBWizards, Exist, HP, IBM, Morphlabs, Phoenix One, Pointwest Technologies, Radix Systems, RCG IT, Safeway Philtech, Spiceworks Consultancy, SQL*Wizard, and Tsukiden Software.

So far, four Focused-Group Discussions (FGD) have been organized and participated in by representatives of the volunteer companies, first at Makati Shangri-La last July 30, second at the IBM Innovation Center UP-Ayala Technohub last August 11, and at the PSIA office last August 26 and September 3.

The two-hour discussions identified competencies that the PSIA can address, as well as the common stumbling blocks faced by the IT sector in immediately ramping up resources so that, as one participant put it, the industry can "go 100mph and reach the destination together."
